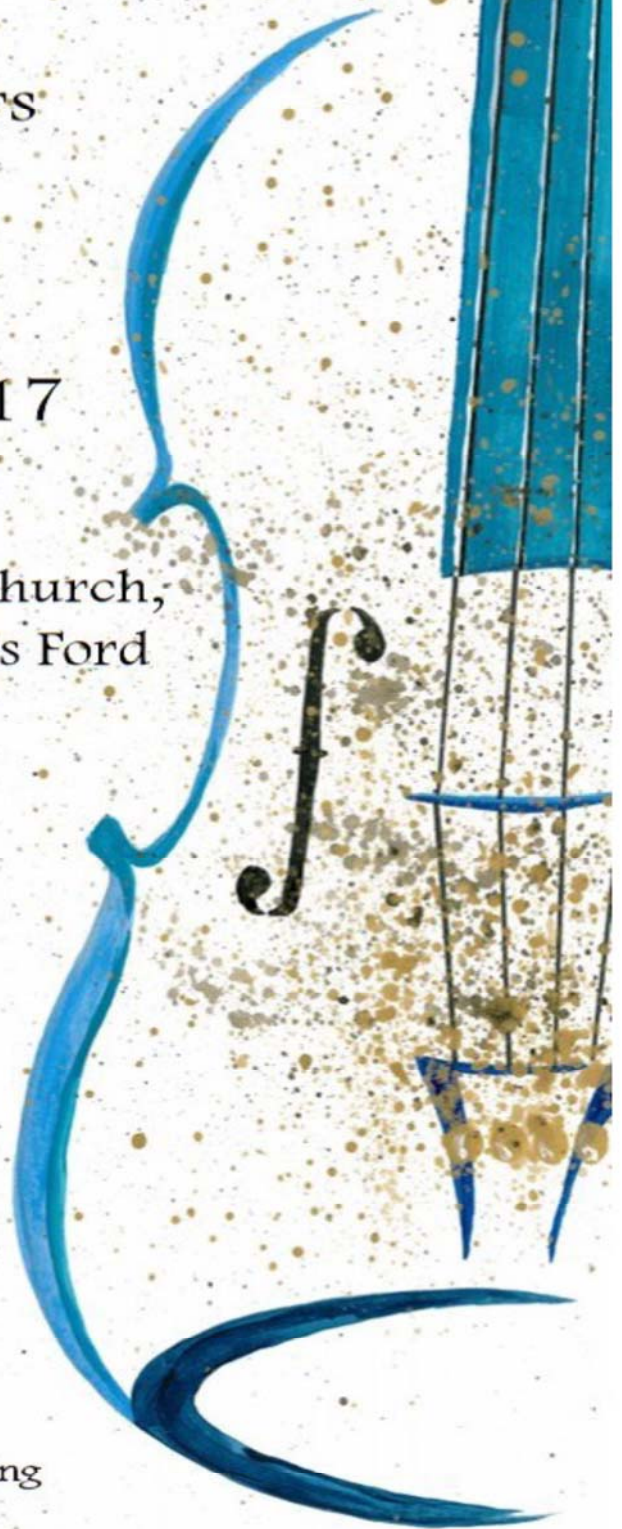

# Biographies

## David Farnell – Director New Music Makers

David Farnell joined the New Music Makers as a tenor in September 2005 and was appointed as Assistant Musical Director in October of that year. He began his musical career at the age of seven learning to play brass instruments and singing in the junior choir of the Salvation Army and later learning piano. At the age of 20 he took part in Contesting Banding as a solo euphonium player and became Principal Euphonium in his late 20's. During this period, he had his first experience of conducting when appointed as Assistant MD of the Southampton Albion Brass Band in addition to performing as Principal Euphonium in bands across the area. David continues to be involved in brass bands and choirs across Southampton.



## Chris Allison – Accompanist New Music Makers

Chris Allison has been accompanist to the New Music Makers since September 2014. He holds a grade 8 distinction in piano and music theory, ABRSM certificate of teaching and BA (hons) degree from Southampton University. Chris has worked as a peripatetic, classroom music teacher, Head of Music, freelance musician and accompanist. Chris has also written for various music journals. He is currently employed part time as Music Director at King's Community Church, Hedge End and combines this with private teaching and his own business running work place choirs across the Southampton area. Chris has played in various venues across the UK and Europe both as a soloist and various ensembles. Chris is married with 3 children and in his spare time enjoys listening to music, reading and travel.



## Lillian Sediles – Director New Music Makers

Lillian Sediles holds a Masters' degrees in Choral Conducting and Music Education, and a Bachelor's degree in Music Education with performance honours. Named the first recipient of the Gregg Smith Conducting Scholarship in 2008, she worked closely with three university choirs, the Syracuse Children's Chorus, and toured with the Hendricks Chapel Choir internationally to China and to South America. After her university studies, Lillian started singing professionally in the Baltimore area, whilst teaching working with a range of ensembles including the Baltimore Choral Society. She has also performed in Carnegie Hall twice, and hopes to return again one day. In early 2015, Lillian, with her husband and daughter, moved to the UK. Since moving, she has been involved in a range of projects including reforming as a guest soloist for Sarisbury Choral Society and being the musical director of the John Lewis Choir.



## **Anna Robinson – Director SYCS**

Anna Robinson trained first as a clarinetist at the University of Southampton where she graduated with a distinction in a Masters in music performance. Anna currently works for Southampton Music Hub as a single reed specialist. Anna thoroughly enjoys conducting Southampton Youth Concert Sinfonia and highlights include co-conducting the orchestras very own last night of the Proms! Anna regularly features as a clarinetist in newly formed orchestra Magna Sinfonia the most recent concert under the direction of the former young conductor in association of the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra Frank Zielhorst performing as principal clarinet for Cesar Franck's Symphony in D Minor. Anna's own musical experiences have encouraged her to work with young musicians to inspire the next generation.



## **Kevin Withell- Director SYCS**

Originally a trombonist and pianist, Kevin's first conducting experience came at the age of 16, when he became assistant conductor of the school's Junior Band and musical director of the String Orchestra. Whilst working towards his Masters at University of Southampton, Kevin was assistant conductor of both Southampton University Symphony Orchestra and Southampton University Sinfonietta. Kevin currently conducts a range of ensembles including Southampton University Concert Band, Southampton Youth Concert Sinfonia and is Assistant Conductor of Southampton Youth Orchestra, as well as taking rehearsals with Worthing Philharmonic Orchestra and London Gay Symphony Orchestra and performing regularly as a trombonist and percussionist.



## **Southampton Youth Concert Sinfonia**

Southampton Youth Concert Sinfonia consists of some of Southampton's most promising young musicians. Aged between 11 and 18, the orchestra rehearse and perform a wide range of repertoire, from Mozart to Hans Zimmer. With an average of six concerts per academic year, the orchestra takes on a demanding yet enjoyable rehearsal schedule. The orchestra will be performing a mix of some of their most enjoyable repertoire paired with a sensitive tribute to Remembrance day with a performance of John William's Hymn to the Fallen. 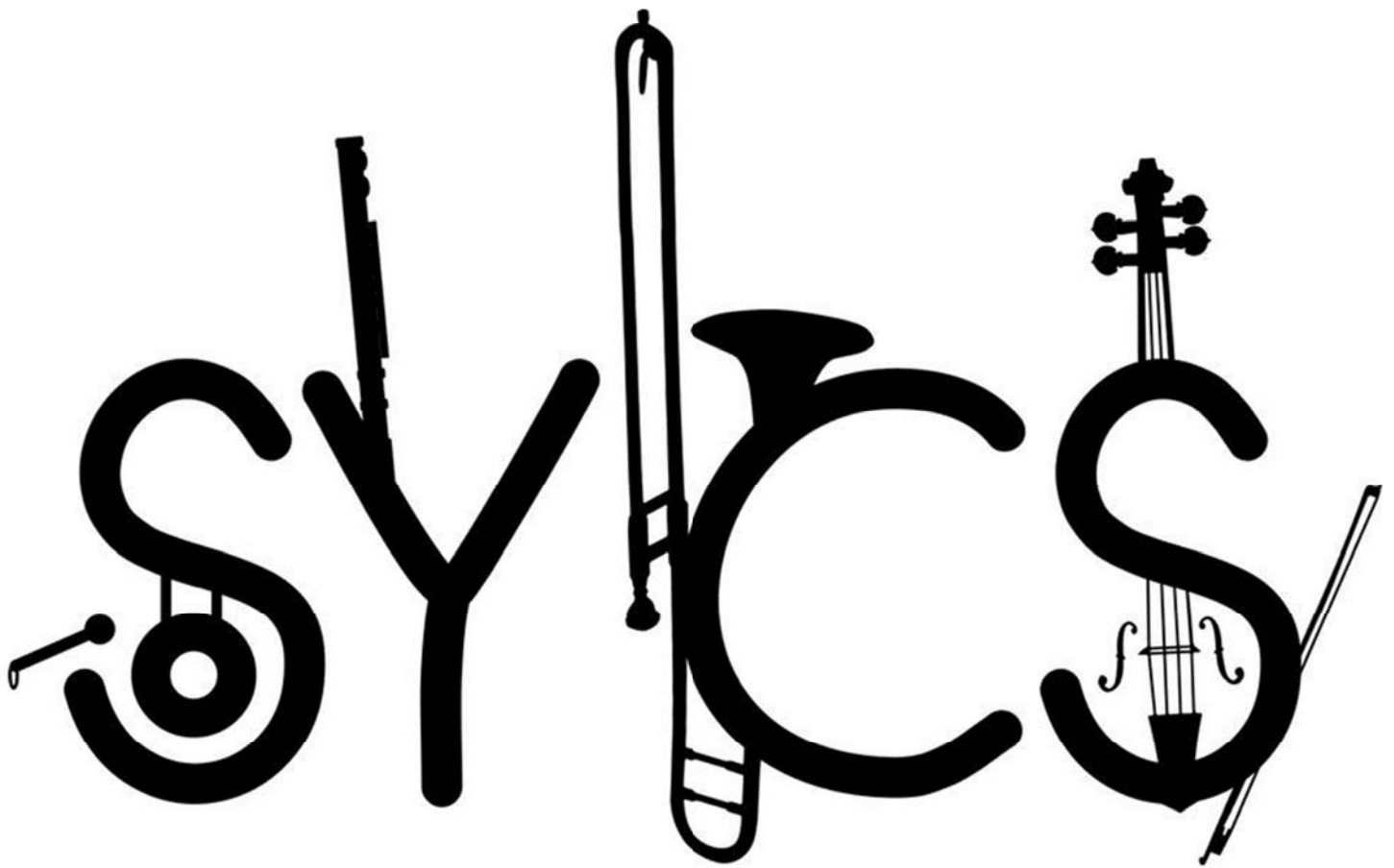
